Each download file contains the quizzes and answer sheet for each chapter in the Start-to-Finish Core Content titles in PDF format. Once you save these files on your computer, you can start using them right away! Double-click the PDF file name and it should automatically open in your default PDF reader program such as Adobe® Acrobat®. Then, you can print as many copies of a quiz that you need.

Opening Quizzes in Start-to-Finish Core Content and Read:OutLoud

- 1. In the **Insert** menu, select **Add eText**.
- 2. Open the quiz by doing one of the following:

If the quiz is in the eText folder, highlight it in the list and click

If the quiz is in another location on your computer, click Browse..., find the quiz and click

Tips

• If you want your learners to use a quiz with the Computer Book open in Start-to-Finish Core Content, insert the quiz as eText. With both tabs open, your learners can easily switch between tabs to read a chapter and then immediately take the quiz. When they are finished, they can easily click the Computer Book tab again to read the next chapter.

Try this: With the Computer Book open, open the quiz (see **Opening Quizzes in Start-to-Finish Core Content and Read:OutLoud**). The quiz appears in a tab next to the Computer Book. Then, ask learners to highlight the correct answer and click the green highlighter in the toolbar.

 If your learners want to hear a quiz read aloud, open it in Start-to-Finish Core Content or Read:OutLoud.

Try this:

- 1. Ask the learners to read a chapter from their paperback book.
- 2. Open the quiz in Read:OutLoud (see **Opening Quizzes in Start-to-Finish Core Content** and **Read:OutLoud**).
- 3. Ask learners to highlight question 1 and the multiple choice answers and click on the toolbar to have the selection read aloud.
- 4. Ask learners to highlight the answer they think is correct and click the green highlighter in the toolbar. Do this for the remaining questions.
