

## Co:Writer Study Leads to Draft:Builder

Don Johnston Incorporated had heard from teachers that there was a need for a tool to help students through the writing process. One group did a study that focused on Co:Writer. In general, observers found that the only students that did not benefit from Co:Writer immediately were the students who were struggling with identifying what they wanted to write and organizing their thoughts. The search began for a tool that would help students with this challenge.

The goal of the project was to research and develop a software application based on best educational pedagogy which would help middle school students with disabilities gather, organize, analyze and synthesize ideas and information for research/writing projects. That researched, field-tested software has evolved into today's Draft:Builder!

## **Draft:Builder the Answer for Struggling Writers**

A simple interface, three views with two windows each, support a student with everything from identifying what they want to write about to organizing their thoughts to naming their sources. Big buttons help them move their information between views. Draft:Builder devotes one tabbed view to each of the three parts of the writing process—outline, notes (research) and draft. They are arranged left to right and lead a student to success with writing. In a single Draft:Builder file, a student can see the whole writing process, from the idea they began with to the writing they did about their chosen subject.

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
